



The Blessing and Sending of the Sunday School From the Book of Common Prayer

Most gracious and loving God, Father and Mother of us all, you have blessed us with the joy and care of children: Give us calm strength and patient wisdom as we bring them up, that we may teach them to love whatever is just and true and good, following the example of our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

God made me and all of you, all of you. God made me and all of you. God loves us madly!

God made me and skies and seas, lots of trees, bumble bees. God made me and frogs and geese. Bzzz, Ribbit, Honk.

Please be seated for the lessons.

At the end of the book of Job, after Job and his companions have argued about the cause of suffering, God finally speaks. God does not directly answer Job's questions, but rather emphasizes God's sovereignty over the cosmos, and invites Job to marvel in its beauty. Some things, it may be inferred, are beyond human understanding.

First Lesson Job 38:1-7

The LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind:

"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?

Gird up your loins like a man,

I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth?

Tell me, if you have understanding.

Who determined its measurements—surely you know!

Or who stretched the line upon it?

On what were its bases sunk.

or who laid its cornerstone

when the morning stars sang together

and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?

Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. Thanks be to God.

Psalm 104: 1-9, 25,

- 1. Bless the Holy One, O my soul; * O God, how excellent is your greatness; you are clothed with majesty and splendor.
- 2. You wrap yourself with light as with a cloak; * you spread out the heavens like a curtain.
- 3. You lay the beams of your chambers in the waters above; * you make the clouds your chariot; you ride on the wings of the wind.
- 4. You make the winds your messengers * and flames of fire your servants.
- 5. You have set the earth upon its foundations, * so that it never shall move at any time.
- 6. You covered it with the Deep as with a mantle; * the waters stood higher than the mountains.
- 7. At your rebuke they fled; * at the voice of your thunder they hastened away.
- 8. They went up into the hills and down to the valleys beneath, * to the places you had appointed for them.
- 9. You set the limits that they should not pass; * they shall not again cover the earth.
- 25.O Holy One, how manifold are your works; * in wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.
- 37.Halleluia.

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Using imagery from scripture and from Jewish worship practices, the passage from Hebrews presents Jesus as a great high priest who is obedient to God's plan for the salvation of the world. Through his suffering and death, Jesus has become the source of eternal salvation.

Second Lesson Hebrews 5:1-10

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with

the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.


So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

"You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Gospel Anthem: verse 1 before the Gospel, verse 2 afterwards



On the way to Jerusalem the disciples ask Jesus to grant them seats of honor when he begins to reign. Jesus responds by telling them that the entrance to this reign is through suffering and self-giving service. The cup and baptism to which he refers is his death on the cross, and the death of self that his followers must undergo as well.

Gospel Lesson Mark 10:35-45

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

If you prefer not to receive bread or wine at this time, place your arms across your chest to receive a blessing, or remain seated and honor Communion in your heart.

You created us to hear your Word, to do your will and to be fulfilled in your love. It is right to thank you.


You sent Jesus to be for us the way we need to follow and the truth we need to know. He gave his life to release us from our sins.

You are the beginning and the end, the last and the first.

Praise, glory and love be yours, from us and from all people, here and everywhere, now and forever. Amen.
